LPF is pleased to announce that our long-standing partnership with the MN DNR, MN BWSR, and the Minnesota Land Trust, in connection with an expanding conservation complex in Stearns County, continues to blossom.


In December, another **70+ acres** were provisionally accepted into this complex by MLT, bringing the total protected area on the site to over 250 acres of habitat — protected for all time.
